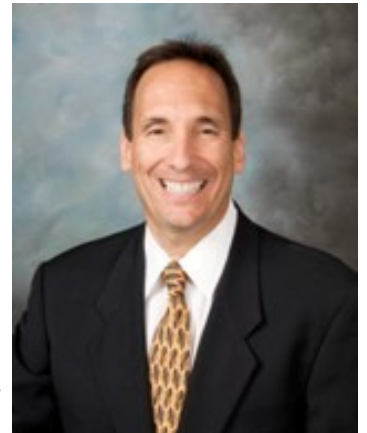

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## TASC Luncheon Speaker for October

TASC is honored to have William M. Paggi Head, Contracts Department Space and Naval Warfare Systems Center, Charleston as our guest speaker. Mr. Paggi will talk about SPAWAR Atlantic and what is both currently happening in Charleston, SC from the contracting perspective and how the future is shaping up. He will also be bringing along some additional contracting SMEs to discuss potential contracts here in the Tidewater/Hampton Roads region.

A native of Canton Ohio, William M. Paggi is a graduate of the College of Charleston where he received a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration in 1977. He later earned a Masters in Business Administration from the Citadel in 1994.

Mr. Paggi started Government Service as a Co Op student in 1975 with the Naval Supply Center (NSC) Charleston. He was accepted in the Navy Acquisition Program in 1977 and graduated as a Contract Specialist in 1979. He was promoted to a Contract Negotiator in 1980 and was responsible for providing contracting support to NAVELEX Charleston and the Charleston Naval Shipyard. Mr. Paggi was promoted to a Procurement Analyst in 1982 where he was responsible for conducting Procurement Management Reviews and providing professional acquisition advice to the different Naval Commands located in the Southeast Contracting Region (SCR) for the Regional Contract Management Staff. During this time, he served as a member of the Navy's Contract Simplification Committee and helped developed simplified contracting methods that were incorporated in the Defense Acquisition Regulation Supplement. He was promoted to a Supervisory Procurement Analyst in 1986. In this position, he served as Director of the RCMS and was responsible for the execution of the PMR Program and providing procurement policy direction, technical assistance, performance appraisal, staffing analysis, and other aspects of functional management for the 217 contracting activities located in the SCR.

Upon transfer of the RCMS to NRCC Philadelphia, Mr. Paggi served as APADE Project Manager for NSC Charleston. His responsibilities included the installation and implementation of the Navy's first automated procurement system. Mr. Paggi was assigned to the position of Director, Contract Administration division in 1988 where he was responsible for the leadership and management of all functions performed in the Division and the administration and management of 150 contracts valued at \$200M.

Mr. Paggi became the Deputy of the Contracts Division for NISE East in 1995, and was promoted to Head of the Contracts Department in 2000. As head of contracts at SSC-CH, Contracts and Logistics Department.

Mr. Paggi is responsible for the leadership and operation of the acquisition and contracting and logistic/supply support programs for the Command. He is responsible for direction and leadership of approximately 130 civilian personnel and is responsible for the execution and management of contracts valued in excess of \$7B.

Mr. Paggi is member of the Acquisition Profession Community, and is a Certified Professional Contracts Manager (CPCM). He has completed Acquisition Level III certification for Contracting and is a recent graduate of the Leadership for a Democratic Society program at the Federal Executive Institute.

### ***Mark Your Calendars for Tuesday November 4th, TASC/TGIC Exchange Brief — “Government Insourcing”***

Our next TASC/TGIC Exchange Briefing will be held November 4, 2009, at the Meyera Oberndorf Library, formerly the Central Library, in Virginia Beach, 0830-1130. The timely, complex, and controversial topic will be **Government Insourcing** which will be addressed by a senior panel representing DoD policy for insourcing contracted services; Government customers with significant contract support and therefore, potential significant insourcing requirements; DoD contractors currently providing support; and Government Human Resources Offices responsible for the Government hiring process upon which insourcing will rely.

For your immediate purposes as well as preparation for the Exchange Brief, you may also want to review the DEPSECDEF memo of 28 May 2009 entitled “In-sourcing Contracted Services – Implementation Guidance,” and a recent letter from some in Congress expressing their concerns to the Secretary. 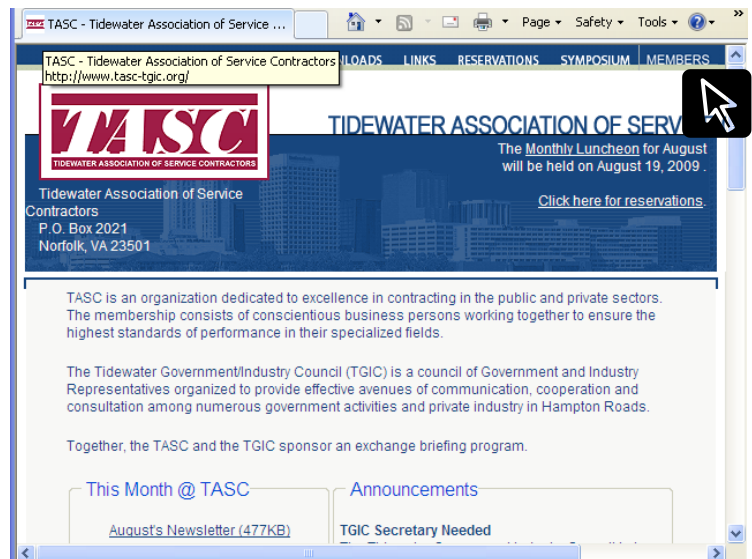
# Navigating the TASC Website

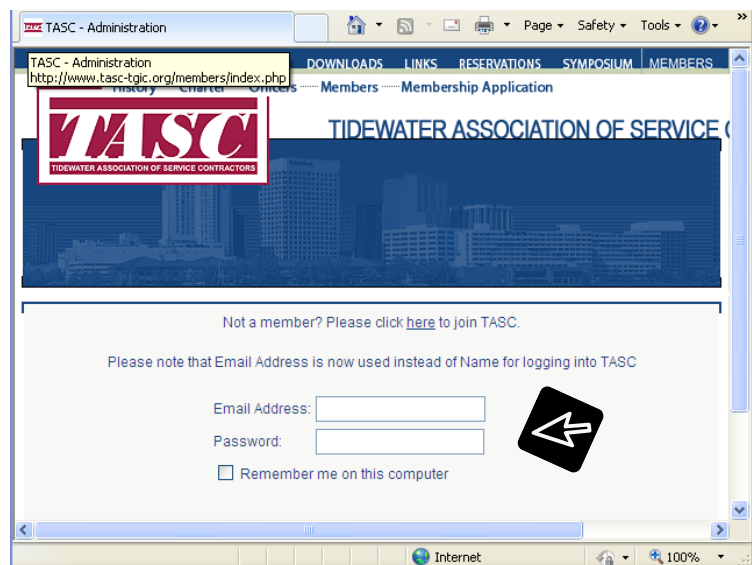
Log onto the TASC website

At this screen you can select My Profile to update personal information.

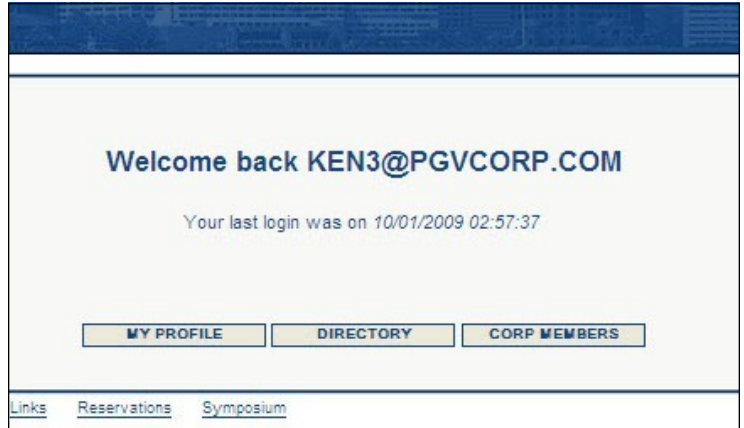


You are now inside your profile and can update all of your contact information.

# Updating Corporate Personal Profile

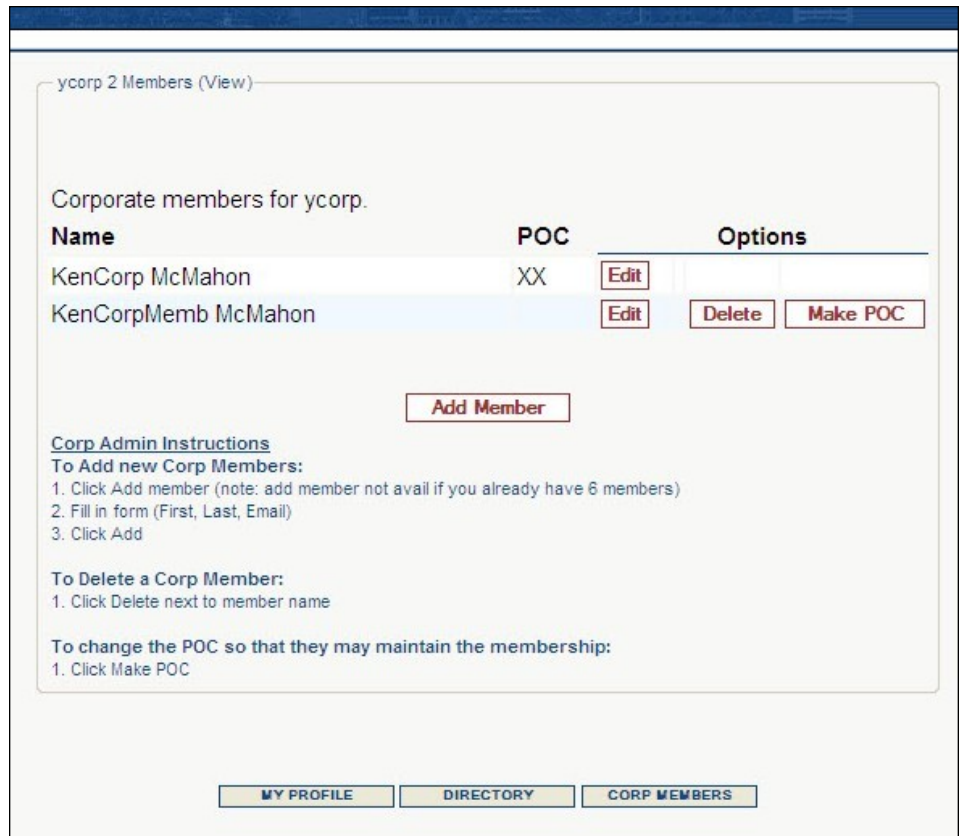
For Corporate Members, the process is a little different. The Login Screen will look like this.
